Year 6 SATs

News from around the school

Nursery: This week we will be focusing our learning around the book by Julia Donaldson, 'Tiddler'. We will also hopefully be making some underwater plants and showing off our painting skills!

Year 1: This week in maths we will be focusing on adding and subtracting using a number line. I will send out some examples and questions to complete as part of this week's homework. We will also be writing some stories based on 'Jack and the Beanstalk'; all about magical plants!

In Art we will be pressing flowers. We would be grateful if you could bring one/some in for us to use please—these will be laminated and sent home. We are also starting to create our class Powerpoint presentation all about plants—each child will create one slide each.

On Friday we will be taking part in various activities to celebrate the Royal wedding. Don't forget that it is a non-school uniform day and the children can wear anything red, white and blue.

Year 3: This week in Beech Class the children will be exploring emotive language as a means of generating new vocabulary based on feelings. The children will also be identifying the features of a diary entry which will help them to independently write a diary entry pretending to be a Viking warrior.

In maths, the children will be adding and subtracting millilitres, litres, centimetres and metres. The children will begin the week by looking at conversions to help them establish a relationship between the different units of measure, before they are provided with some tricky problems.

Year 5: This week year 5 have a test week, with tests being taken in maths, arithmetic, reading and SPaG. As well as this, we will be writing instructions in English that create a recipe to cure 'sweating sickness', a deadly disease in Tudor times. In maths we will be working on the relationship between fractions and decimals and in SPaG we will be developing our knowledge of inverted commas.

During our topic lessons we will be looking at Tudor crimes and punishments, completing our large drawings of Henry VIII and learning about Pentecost in RE.

Don't forget, there is a staff vs children rounders match after school on Tuesday and our Express Event is on Tuesday 22nd May at 2.15pm—we hope to see lots of you then!

Reception: This week in Oak Class we will be focusing our learning around the story, 'Mister Seahorse'. We will be learning some new poems and rhymes and thinking about the skills we need to perform them to others.

In maths we will be revisiting pattern and exploring capacity; we will also be using our mathematical knowledge and our thinking skills to solve problems throughout the week. We will be thinking about all the forms of technology that we use at home and at school and how they help us.

Thank you to everyone who has joined us for our sharing events this term. This Friday will be our last one so we would love you to join us for some outdoor games on the field (weather permitting).

Year 2: This week in maths we will be practising our multiplication and division skills. We will be looking at the different methods we can use to solve these calculations then applying these methods to solve a range of reasoning questions.

Our work in literacy this week will focus on the story, 'The Pea and the Princess' by Mini Grey. At the beginning of the week, we will be writing a diary entry from the point of view of the pea then towards the end of the week we will be writing a narrative based on the story.

As our SATs are fast approaching we will also be going through some SATs style questions throughout the week to ensure we are fully prepared.

Year 4: This week in Literacy we will be writing our own Newspaper reports. We will be recounting a Viking raid on Britain from the perspective of the Viking invaders or the Saxon settlers. While in Maths, we will be applying the skills we have been developing during term 5 to complete our termly arithmetic and reasoning tests. In our topic lesson we will be taking part in a practical history lesson. We will be investigating how Vikings dyed cloth using natural materials.

Can children please make sure they have their PE kit in school every day, including plimsolls or trainers.
