### Verifying Messages from Teachers2Parents

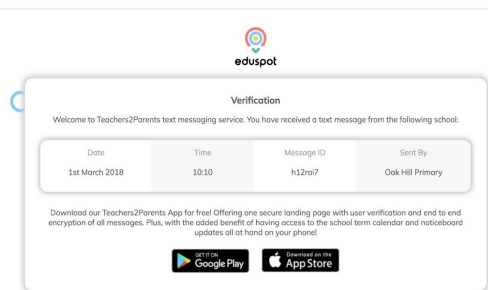
Teachers2Parents, our texting service provider, have an additional security verification system so that you can always check that texts have genuinely been sent from the school. When you receive a text, it will come from a secure number. The school message ID will be in the body of the message accompanied by a link at the beginning of the message that you can click to go through to a Teachers2Parents verification page—this confirms that the send of the message is genuine. Please note that this is not available on the App version as this offers built in user verification.

# News from around the school

**Nursery:** Welcome back to term 5! This term we will be basing our learning around 'Who lives in a rock pool?'

We hope to go on a trip to the beach this term; please check bags for a letter!

This week has been very warm, please ensure your child has a sun hat and sun cream applied before coming to school, thank you.

This week we will be looking at mermaids!! We will be creating our own mermaids, making mermaid combs and thinking about where they might like to live. We will also be creating some lovely 'under the sea' artwork.

**Reception:** Welcome back to a new term, we hope you all had a restful Easter break. This term our topic is 'who lives in a rock pool?'

We have already started to think about what we know about the sea and the beach and the good weather last week allowed us to have some fun the sun to start our term's learning! This topic will allow us to investigate different habitats and what might live there. We will also be thinking about water safety and pollution.

Our parent sharing sessions start again on Friday. This term we will be exploring outdoor learning so we hope you will all be able to join us. Come dressed to get a little bit muddy as we may be using the woodland area as part of that learning.

As the weather may be changeable this term, can we please ask that children come in with sun hats when the weather is warm but bear in mind they may still need a jacket or coat on the cooler days. Thank you.

This week in Willow Class, we will continue to water our sunflowers and hopefully observe them growing into little shoots. We will also be looking closely at the cress we planted and placed in different areas in the classroom to see which grows the best.

In Numeracy we will be looking at division and in Literacy we are using the book, 'The Enormous Turnip' to create posters to advertise why we should eat different types of vegetables.

Well done to everyone who read last week. I can't believe what an amazing difference it is having with the children's progress and their confidence. I know time is short in the evenings but even if you read a few pages with your child, it will make a huge difference for them.

**Year 2:** Welcome back to term 5. We hope you all had a lovely Easter Break.

This term all our writing will be focused around the text, 'The Secret Garden' by Frances Hodgson Burnett. We will start the week off by finding out about the key character in the story, Mary Lennox. We will be writing a character description on Mary then putting ourselves in the place of Mary to help us write a diary entry.

In maths this week we will be working with money. We will be calculating the cost of two or more items in a shop to make sure we have enough money in our piggy bank to buy both items. Towards the end of the week we will be calculating change.

Our topic work this week will investigate how plants transport water. We will be carrying out a 'Rainbow of Flowers' experiment to help us understand how water is transported. We will be placing white carnations into a vase of water, adding drops of food colouring and marking on the vase to indicate the level of water. We will then watch over a few days to see what happens to the water level and the white carnations.

**Year 3:** This week in Beech class the children will be learning about relative clauses in Literacy and securing their understanding of the different features of a non-chronological report.

In maths the children will be securing their knowledge of multiplication and division, through using the bus stop and grid method. The children will be applying their understanding of the two skills to solve tricky word problems towards the end of the lesson.

PE—just a reminder that we have PE on Monday and Wednesday; hopefully we will start to have more of the nice weather and therefore will be conducting PE outside.

**Year 4:** This week in literacy we will be researching facts about Anglo-Saxon life using the ipads. We will then be writing our own non-chronological reports using the facts that we have found out. While, in Maths, we will be developing our knowledge of measures and applying these skills to answer a range of problems.

In our topic lessons we will be designing our own Saxon settlement and looking in detail at a Saxon burial site.

This term PE will be on a Tuesday and Wednesday. However, can children please make sure they have their PE kit in school everyday, including plimsolls or trainers.

**Year 5:** Welcome back after the Easter break. Birch Class have started their Tudor topic brilliantly and seem to like the gruesome side to it!

This week in English we are going to be looking at Tudor riddles, both performing and writing our own.

In maths we will be working on both Roman numerals and rounding large numbers, including numbers up to a million.

Topic lessons this week will see us looking at the artwork of Hans Holbein and recreating some of his portraits of famous Tudors and also finding out about the many wives of Henry VIII.

Don't forget: all children should have a full PE kit in school. As the weather improves, we try to do our PE lessons outside as much as we can.

**Year 6:** This week in Sycamore Class, we are starting our final push towards the SAT's papers. In Maths the focus is measurements and geometry. We are going to be looking at reasoning questions around these two areas and making sure we are reading the questions carefully and doing enough to pick up the maximum number of marks.

In writing, we are going to be researching about Anne Boleyn and finding the skills to write persuasively. With these skills and information we are going to write to King Henry VIII persuading him not to imprison us!

In Topic, we will be looking at Henry VIII wives in more detail; who were they, how did they die, why were there so many?!

PE will be on Tuesday and Wednesday this week. A big thank you for the whole class as everyone had their kits last week.
