






\Rightarrow	Vary sentence structure, using different openers	
\Rightarrow	Use adjectival phrases (eg biting cold wind)	
\Rightarrow	Use appropriate choice of noun or pronoun	
\Rightarrow	Use fronted adverbials	
\Rightarrow	Use apostrophe for plural possession	
\Rightarrow	Use a comma after fronted adverbial (eg Later that day, I heard bad news)	
\Rightarrow	Use commas to mark clauses	
\Rightarrow	Use inverted commas and other punctuation to punctuate direct speech	
\Rightarrow	Use paragraphs to organise ideas around a theme	
\Rightarrow	Use connecting adverbs to link paragraphs	
\Rightarrow	Write with increasing legibility, consistency and fluency

Maths

- ⇒ Count backwards through zero to include negative numbers
- ⇒ Compare and order numbers beyond 1000
- ⇒ Compare and order numbers with up to 2 decimal places
- ⇒ Read Roman numerals to 100
- ⇒ Find 1000 more/less than a given number
- \Rightarrow Count in multiples of 6, 7, 9, 25 and 1000
- ⇒ Recall and use multiplication and division facts for all times tables to 12 x 12
- ⇒ Recognise the place value of any 4 digit number
- ⇒ Round any number to the nearest 10, 100 or 1000
- ⇒ Round decimals with 1 decimal place to nearest whole number
- ⇒ Add and subtract numbers with up to 4 digits using written columnar method
- ⇒ Multiply 2 digits by 1 digit and 3 digits by 1 digit
- ⇒ Count up and down in hundredths
- ⇒ Recognise and write equivalent fractions
- ⇒ Add and subtract fractions with the same denominator
- ⇒ Read, write and convert time between analogue and digital 12 and 24 hour clocks
